Pennypack Trust Bat Workshop

John Chenger, a world renowned bat expert with Bat Conservation and Management, will present a program on bats of the Pennypack Creek valley at the Pennypack Ecological Restoration Trust. The evening will begin with a PowerPoint presentation about bats in the visitors' center, and then (weather permitting) participants will be invited to join John in the field to capture bats in mist nets and to identify the species caught.

Providing our Fish a Lift: Rock-Ramp Fishways on the Pennypack Creek

Saturday, June 14, 9 a.m. to 11 a.m.

Manmade dams and utility pipes crossing our creeks inhibit migratory fish and other aquatic organisms from completing their natural upstream journeys. By removing dams or installing fishways, native fish and other species can be re-established throughout the watershed, enhancing the ecology of our stream systems. Philadelphia Water Department biologists and restoration staff will provide a tour of the fishway recently constructed on a sewer crossing on the Pennypack Creek, and discuss the exciting movement of dam removal and fishway construction all along the Pennypack. Biological assessments of the Pennypack Creek, including aquatic life, water quality and stormwater challenges to the stream, will also be shared, using the Pennypack Creek as an outdoor classroom.
